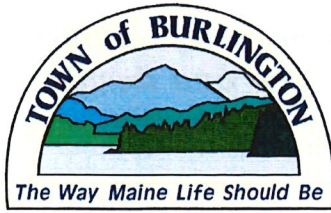

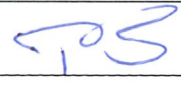

The board reviewed and initialed the Profit and Loss /Trial Balance statements for the BLT as of May 31st, 2026. A compactor at the BLT needs repair. Atlantic Recycling will be coming on Tues. June 16th to take measurements and to assess what needs to be done. The school budget town meeting was held on Monday June 8th. The school budget for the fiscal year 2027 was approved. The board received a 'Thank you' card from Maureen Bean for the donation of \$5,000.00 to the food pantry that was approved by residents at the town meeting on March 30th, 2026. There was also discussion on the amount of cardboard coming from the pantry being taken to the BLT. A subdivision request on Long Ridge Road was made by a resident. Certified letters have been sent to landowners abutting the property.

OLD BUSINESS: REQUEST TO PURCHASE SAND/GRAVEL HIGH LEVEL ALARM FOR PUMPING STATION WORKSHOP PLANNING BOARD APPOINTMENTS GRANT FOR PLAYGROUND <i>The board again discussed the request to purchase sand/gravel from the town owned pit in Grand Falls. A vote was made 3-0 to not allow the sale.</i> <i>The board discussed hiring someone to dig near the town office building to locate the sewer line and electrical conduits before starting the excavation to replace the old septic tank. The town needs only a plumbing permit to replace the old septic tank if needed. Still getting high level alarms periodically for pumping station from town office.</i> <i>The board was informed of the Elected Officials workshop on June 24th.</i> <i>First selectman, John Smith, spoke with legal counsel about planning board appointments and how to best deal with issues that arise.</i> <i>The board received a letter informing them of \$1,000.00 grants available for playgrounds.
