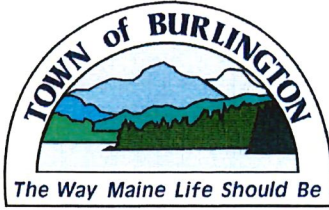

There were 2 estimates for replacing the septic tank at the town office. Irelands Construction and A&G Dirtworks. The board voted 3-0 to go with A&G Dirtworks. Their quote was considerably less than Irelands.

The board has donated the 5-ton military truck to Haynesville volunteer fire department.

The board discussed the parking area in the center of town as per an e-mail from a resident. There are no plans for a parking area at this time.

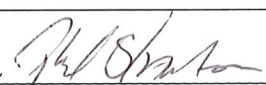
